The intended purpose of the funds for this Abbey spiritual retreat ministry expansion is to provide opportunities
for more people to grow in their journey in lifelong Catholic missionary discipleship through God's love. This
ministry includes expanding current and offering new spiritual retreats for guests. These would include the
following for one calendar year:

a. 12/Monthly Days of Recollection

This day long retreat consists of two conferences, Mass, lunch, adoration and an opportunity for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Time: 10:00 AM-3:00 PM.

b. 4/Evenings of Recollection

This evening retreat would include a meal, conference, adoration and an opportunity for the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

c. 2/Weekend Retreats

These one day retreats held on the weekend would include a focus of God's Divine Mercy/Eucharist and His Divine Love. These retreats would be sacramentally driven by the Eucharist, adoration, and the Sacrament of Reconciliation as well as help accommodate those people working during the week.

2. The expected results/benefits of this ministry's project will be to increase the number of retreatants that attend the Abbey the current Days of Recollection from an average of 50 people to 75 people per month. The Evening of Recollections and the new weekend day retreats will be new Abbey programming. A goal of 50 participants for the Evening of Recollection and weekend day retreats has been set.

These retreats will use an evaluation form filled out by all participants. These are used by the Abbey staff and spiritual committee to provide topics that our guests are asking for in their journey to become lifelong Catholic missionary disciples. In addition, these forms will also measure: overall experience, food, lodging, conference room space and if they participant was able to "rediscover peace" while spending time at the Abbey.

The benefits of this project will be shared with others through marketing (Bishop's Bulletin, emails, website, Facebook, radio, newsletters, pamphlets, etc.) Word of mouth will be an important factor as well. By sharing these opportunities with priests, faith formation directors, youth group leaders, current guests and those new to the Abbey will help bring awareness to this faith-filled opportunities available at the Abbey of the Hills.

1. Description of project:

When a person struggles with reading, the personal and social impacts can be profound and result in detrimental life long effects. A person who is unable to read may have low self-esteem or feel emotions such as shame, fear, and powerlessness. According to a study by the Literacy Project, three out of five persons in American prisons cannot read. According to the Department of Justice, "The link between academic failure and delinquency, violence, and crime is welded to reading failure. Over 70% of inmates in America's prisons cannot read above a fourth grade level." This means they lack the reading skills to navigate many everyday tasks or hold down anything but lower (paying) jobs. When inmates who left school before receiving a high school diploma were asked the main reason they dropped out of school, about one-third reported they lost interest or experienced academic difficulty.

The lack of development of reading skills can result from a number of factors in a person's life including lack of effective instruction in school, and chronic absenteeism and truancy. However, the most common cause of illiteracy is learning disabilities and dyslexia. In the general population, one out of every five persons has dyslexia. Among the prison population, undiagnosed dyslexia is rampant. Very few studies have been done to determine the rate of dyslexia among the prison population, but it is suspected that it could be as high as 50 percent. A 2000 study of prisoners in Texas showed that 48 percent of inmates were dyslexic and two-thirds struggled with reading comprehension.

There is reason for hope. Studies have shown a reduction in violent behavior during incarceration after receiving a GED and participating in college coursework. Research shows that providing inmates with meaningful education is one of the surest ways of reducing the rate at which they end up back behind bars after being released.

South Dakota Department of Corrections offers a GED program within the prisons, but teaching systematic and explicit instruction in reading is not a service that is not currently offered. Without the ability to read, inmates are not able to study to obtain their GED. This proposal seeks to make an organic change within the prison to bring remedial reading instruction to prisoners through peer to peer tutoring. There are many challenges to providing appropriate education to address illiteracy within the prison most often related to funding and finding personnel to fill the positions. Time constraints for visitors severely limits the options for utilizing volunteers. What is unique about The SD Prison Literacy Project is that it has been designed to identify inmates to are interested in being trained as volunteer tutors to teach reading skills to their fellow inmates.

A volunteer with Diocese of Sioux Falls Prison Ministry, who has a professional background in special education with a specialty in dyslexia and reading instruction, will serve as a supervisor, trainer and consultant for the project. Currently, there are inmates who have been identified by the Catholic Prison Ministry who are regular participants in prison ministry and who are interested in this project both to be tutors and to receive tutoring. The Diocese of Sioux Falls Prison Ministry is interested in the project because it addresses the dignity of the human person. It clearly fits the Diocese's vision of missionary discipleship.

2. Expected results/benefits of the ministry's project:

The project is intended to bring hope; to bring transformation and healing to a person's life by giving them the ability to read. This will allow prisoners who have struggled to read to be able to access Truth, Beauty and Goodness through Scripture, the teachings of the church, tools of prison ministry, and good literature. Reading can enhance their personal formation and it also can enhance their ability to communicate with family members. Upon release from prison, if a prisoner has learned to read and obtained a GED, their prospects for employment are widened. Further, another expected benefit of this project is that it will encourage the prisoners to minister to one another creating a spirit of missionary discipleship within the prison walls. The initial plan is to begin with two prisoners who will train to be tutors with the hope of expanding the number of tutors.

Sioux Falls Area Community Foundation is a potential grant source for expanding the project. A preliminary conversation with personnel has indicated that this is a project that would be of interest.

Additionally, the hope would be for the prison administration and South Dakota Department of Corrections to recognize the project and expand it further with ongoing funding.

Survivors Joining 4 Hope (SJ4H) is a fund specifically for survivors of suicide loss. The fund is intended to help low to moderate income people with funeral expenses and other immediate basic needs after the loss of a loved one including but not limited to transportation to the funeral, food, housing, and immediate mental health crisis intervention. Our organization focuses on the loss of youth specifically, but we serve the entire state of South Dakota, and we help anyone who has had the loss of an immediate family member.

Survivors Joining for Hope began as a nonprofit organization founded in 2016 by Brad Hearst of Sioux Falls, S.D., after his brother died by suicide. The name of the organization honors his brother, Sergei Joseph Hearst, through its initials. SJ4H was founded to provide funding to families that had suffered a loss by suicide so they could focus on grief recovery instead of financial pressure.

The SJ4H board initially had four members; over six years, it grew to 11 members. By 2022, the organization's initial focus on the Sioux Empire had expanded to cover the entire state of South Dakota and beyond—SJ4H has served people from nearly every state on the East and West Coasts. Its programming also expanded to include a support network, support groups, and suicide prevention programming for youth.

On August 1, 2022, Survivors Joining For Hope disbanded as a separate organization, and its work and mission became part of Lost&Found as a new department focused on postvention services.

 Expected results/benefits of the ministry's project: (How will project be evaluated? How many people will be served? Anticipated long-range benefits? How will project benefits be shared with others?)

Our community health worker follows up with families several times after they initially apply for funding. These follow-up calls are intended to ensure families have been properly connected with any services that they require such as food, housing, and mental health counseling. Our organization tracks those referrals, and we follow up with families to ensure that they have indeed connected with those services. Additionally, we send a survey out to families who have received help through the fund to us. To assess whether the funds have been helpful in their life functioning. We assist approximately 50 families per year, and we anticipate that the need will grow as awareness of our services increases. We have begun to share, and will continue to share these family stories via our social media channels.

3. Financial analysis of project including how project in included in budget:

Each family we support is eligible for up to \$2,500 worth of funding. We occasionally make exceptions for families in dire need. We cover the cost of funeral expenses, transportation, cleaning up homes, cleaning, and repair of homes as needed, and other basic immediate needs. This program is staffed by one full-time community health worker.

Lost&Found was able to hire a community health worker (CHW) to manage this program through a CHW grant from the South Dakota Department of Health and walk alongside families as they process the grief and complex logistics of losing a loved one to suicide. That grant runs out in May. We have funded the SJ4H direct-support fund exclusively through gifts from the community. Increased need in our community has resulted in us seeking alternative sources of funding in order to provide direct support to families. Sioux Empire United Way has pledged \$25,000 to the fund.

1. Description of project:

(What is the ministry's intended purpose? How will the ministry achieve its goal?)

In my short time as chaplain at O'Gorman, it is evident to me that many students, especially Catholic, do not know what being a part of the Catholic Church means. To some degree that is normal, growing up in a parish and Catholic school setting, where your experience of the Church is very local. However I think there is a higher risk of this in our time. With the many negative influences that can lead young people away from the Church, I resonate with C.S. Lewis' desire (given in Mere Christianity) to tell people, who claim to be in a post-Christian society, what Christianity truly is. I desire to give a real tangibility to students for their faith to be something very real, very incarnational. While this goal is achieved in certain ways in the classroom and other school-related activities, I believe a pilgrimage to Rome would help reveal that much more concretely.

I believe that our Catholic schools have a crucial role in helping Bishop DeGrood's vision of lifelong missionary disciples to take root. Many of the students who would sign up for this pilgrimage would be disciples, at various levels of depth. Some are close to being at the level of missionary, but I believe many are still at a place of following, rather than being a true missionary. In my conversations with students from North Dakota, especially seminarians, many of them went on a pilgrimage to Rome through their Catholic high schools, and it was one of the catalysts for their deeper conversions. Seeing the tombs of saints, the Holy Father, and pilgrims from all over the world, they received a much greater sense of what it meant to be to be Catholic. It gave them a greater love for their Catholic faith and a deeper realization of what they are a part of.

As stated in the application above, this would be open to juniors and seniors. We will assess after the first year of the feasibility, but my long-term desire would for this to be an annual trip where we have more juniors than seniors. While seniors have a bit more maturity, having juniors (incoming seniors) allows us to build greater relationships and continue to unpack the graces received during their senior year. North Dakota's high school pilgrimages target this class as well and it has given their seniors a greater ability to be faithful leaders for the school.

The pilgrimage will be a true pilgrimage. I am working with Lolek Pilgrimage LLC out of Lincoln, NE. She has organized pilgrimages before, mainly for high school students. What drew me to use Lolek is that our visions aligned. I didn't want it to be a glorified school trip or vacation but a true pilgrimage—to encounter God and His Church. The planned accommodations are very humble and all the planned tours will be about the Church or Ancient Rome (the seed bed for the Church). Of course there will be some time for shopping or wandering a bit, but almost all of our time will be centered on the fact that God became flesh, dwelt among us, and promised to remain with us always, through the Church. The pilgrimage will be 10-11 days in Rome and Assisi. The goal is to also do a 1-day retreat in Assisi. On a human level, that will be well received, after having some full days. Spiritually I think it could help them truly reflect on what they've been experiencing.

Lastly, another priority for Bishop DeGrood has been the ongoing formation of those serving in ministry. In the strategic planning for Bishop O'Gorman Schools, a continuing theme is for a continued formation for faculty and staff. The hope of this pilgrimage would be to have 30 students and 6-7 chaperones. This would include me, perhaps another priest, perhaps the PES sisters, and other O'G teachers. The first thought probably goes to the theology teachers, which is great, but I would like for other teachers to have the chance to go on this pilgrimage in later years. Not only would it allow them to continue to grow in relationship with the students, it would also give them the chance to experience the Catholic faith more deeply, most of them never having been to Rome. Most teachers will likely not have the chance to take a pilgrimage to Rome, especially while they are still teaching at O'Gorman. Each chaperone (except for me) would have

a small group that they would be in charge of during the pilgrimage. This will be for logistics and communication but also to be a real spiritual leader themselves.

2. Expected results/benefits of the ministry's project:

(How will project be evaluated? How many people will be served? Anticipated long-range benefits? How will project benefits be shared with others?)

If we have a number of juniors sign-up, we will be able to measure the fruits of the trip in the short-term during their senior year. Although many pilgrimages continue to bear fruit and are sometimes more fruitful years down the road. One teacher at OG who helped with a pilgrimage to Rome 5 years ago said that he still has students reach out every once in a while about how good of a trip it was for him. If we fulfill our mission, we will have some recent graduates and incoming seniors grow in their relationship with God and His Church, as well as being more equipped to be an authentic missionary disciple. Many of them have spent 12 years in Catholic education where they have learned about the Church. A long-term benefit of this pilgrimage would be that those students who have the head knowledge would then gain the heart knowledge and awareness that the faith encompasses all of life—not just one subject manner.

As stated above, the goal is for 30 students and 6-7 chaperones.

Financial analysis of project including how project is included in budget: (You may wish to attach a proposed budget for income and expensing of this project's direct costs.)

There is no budget for this pilgrimage. All costs are up to the participants. They are able to do personal fundraising at their parishes if they need, with approval from their pastors. The anticipated cost per person right now (which fluctuates depending on airfare) is \$3,500. That includes everything—airfare, lodging, meals, entry fees to museums, tour guides, etc.—except for food on the 2 travel days and any personal souvenirs and gifts. This is a reasonable price for a 10-11 day pilgrimage. However, Lolek adjusts this price based on how to consider the chaperones. Typically the leader is free, and she will adjust the student price up if chaperones are also to be aided in some way.

The request for this grant is to keep the student price where it is, or if it has to be raised, to raise it very little. The leader's trip is included, but I would like to help the other chaperones partially. It may be covering flights, or covering everything except the flights, or even just paying a certain amount and they cover the rest. There is also the possibility of having 2 PES sisters, and they would not be able to cover their pilgrimage. If they were to be fully covered, that would be an additional \$233 per student (if there are 30 students). To help cover partial costs for other teachers would only increase that amount. The requested amount would help cover almost 3 chaperones for the trip.

At this point there are none. I did talk to the Development Office at O'Gorman that we are doing this to put it on their radar. Sometimes they have people who call in and want to donate to something but don't know what. There could be some given to this but at this point there is no outside funding.

Since the start of this nonprofit ministry we now have a house that has completed the process of zoning and approval from the city of Aberdeen. This house can house five guests. These guests arrive from various situational needs such as release from jail, prison, addiction treatment completion, eviction, mental health issues, job loss, and homelessness.

Moving forward the ministry is currently working on completing a second house to house more guests and provide temporary shelter alongside long term shelter to help guests with a step up every step of the way. We are looking for this one-time financial support to reach our goal of having two established shelters and helping meet the needs of people in the community. We intend on staying connected with the Catholic Community Foundation as we move forward and grow. The goal is to have this house up and running and housing guests by fall. The long term goal is to be able to help all those in need and that will consist of a need for a larger facility, financial funding, continued partnerships with community people and resources as we grow and go forward.

As many guests as we have helped we have had to turn many away as we are lacking in needed funding to help these people in need. There is currently a waiting list of guests in need as they are looking for a change in their life to better themselves. We feel this ministry is a great benefit to the community as it helps people in so many needed areas and brings people together in the community.

Aberdeen Step Up Ministries is a faith-based organization. Our mission is to work alongside and partner with existing missions and agencies in the community by offering additional resources to carry out the full mission of Christ, where he asked of his followers: feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, welcome the stranger, clothe the naked, heal the sick, and visit the imprisoned. (Matthew 25:35-39). Our plan is to do as Jesus said, "What you do unto the least of these my brethren, you do unto me."

A key area of ministry for Aberdeen Step Up, is to provide temporary emergency shelter for those who are homeless, work alongside assisting existing agencies and churches in our community to transition these needy people into more permanent living arrangements and connect them with vital resources. The need in our community is critical. There is currently no other agency in Aberdeen that is focused on providing temporary emergency shelter. Since our organization's inception, we have provided temporary housing to more than 100 individuals.

Our group is helping children in the Child Protective Services program with new clothing, as well as providing other impoverished children with clothing, diapers, and other resources whose needs are not able to be met. So far, we have been able to help over a two dozen needy children.

We also assist our clients with life and job skills. Again, we connect these folks with community agencies and resources such as SD Job Service and Vocational Rehab. One area we work extensively in is helping people get proper credentials to be able to get a job and a more permanent place to live. To this point in our history, we have helped more than 50 people get their vital credentials restored and find employment.

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

Brief summary of project:

The Aberdeen Catholic Community launched Elizabeth Ministry over the course of the last year. It is rooted in the beautiful gospel account of the visitation, whereby Mary goes to Elizabeth, sharing the joys and journey of pregnancy at childrearing, even at their varied ages and stages of life. There is something incredibly powerful about women sharing their faith and practical knowledge on a very personal level. Elizabeth Ministry connects women as we seek to honor life, cherish children, encourage families, uplift marriages and build community. Elizabeth Ministry is an international ministry, that began in Wisconsin in 1991. Aberdeen Elizabeth Ministry is registered with the international organization and excited to see how our chapter uniquely serves the women in this pastorate.

Elizabeth Ministry practically looks like this: a woman has a life event, such as pregnancy, miscarriage, etc. Her family makes a referral to Elizabeth Ministry on her behalf. The core team assigns a minister to serve the woman. She will bring a comfort care gift and informational resources to the woman. As the minister serves the woman, she may call, text, visit and pray with the woman, giving tangible support and care on behalf of the Aberdeen Catholic community. If needed, the ministry's Meal Train coordinator may be notified that extra support of meals are warranted. The minister continues to support the woman as needed on average for six months.

Currently, Elizabeth Ministry has prayer warriors, homebound parishioners, praying for the establishment and fruitfulness of the ministry as part of the "One Vine, Many Branches" movement.

Logistically, with the support of both parishes and the St. Theresa's women circle at Sacred Heart, the ministry was introduced to the parish. In response, 45 women stepped forward to offer their services as ministers. Training sessions have been held and the ministry is currently serving several women in need, with experiences ranging from transitioning to a new town, childrearing, divorce and breast cancer.

Equipping ministers has been the focus of the core team to date. Training materials are

expensive, providing each minister with a visitor's manual, costing about \$50/each is a challenge. However, with the support of the parishes, the core team will continue to work toward that goal. With a framework in place to empower ministers to serve others, the core team has discerned that there is a need to tell our story and connect with the greater community using larger events and providing quality resources to help establish our "brand."

Elizabeth Ministry currently is planning two programs for the upcoming year, one addresses miscarriage, still birth and infant loss presented by The Lourdes Center Staff. We estimate this program will cost approximately \$500 which includes presenter fee and travel expenses, along with materials for the event. Additionally, we are planning a community wide grief event, Painted Prayer, with artist Jessy Paulson, who will be traveling to Aberdeen from Alcester, also at a cost of approximately \$500.

Finally, part of our ministry, during one-on-one visits includes comfort care packages. We seek to provide women with quality goods that will prove effective in wrapping them in Christ's love during challenging experiences, such as miscarriage. Our vision is to supplement the journals and brochures we have on hand with a lovely blanket, rosary and personal care items. We are requesting an additional \$500 for quality outreach materials.

The core team envisions that by doing our key events well this first year and taking good care of the women referred for individual ministry, word will spread, providing a more natural flow for fundraising and inviting others to partner with Elizabeth Ministry financially. Elizabeth Ministry's long-range goal is to provide support to women during their journey of childbearing years and beyond. This is a new ministry, launched last year in the Aberdeen Catholic community. It provides one-on-one support, by ministers sharing their practical experiences through the lens of the gospel story of Mary and Elizabeth. The ministry has an overarching vision to evangelize women outside the pews: meeting them where they are at, be it childbearing, miscarriage, fertility concerns, breast cancer, menopause, empty nest, blending families, etc. The ministry functions on referrals, so getting the word out, building community awareness and forming ministers well is essential to the long-term sustainability of the ministry. This year a significant number of women in the Aberdeen area have suffered miscarriage, creating our most urgent need.

We expect that our intentional programming will be a blessing to women that do not know about Elizabeth Ministry, but are in need of support with grief due to infant loss, miscarriage or still birth. Furthermore, we see the creative program, Painted Prayer, as an opportunity for any woman grieving from a variety of losses to be served. We project that between 20-40 people will be served by programming. We anticipate that by encountering Christ and the love of others, women will flourish, even in grief, sharing the good news of Christ's love with others. By encountering comfort and love, we anticipate that the women served will spread the word about Elizabeth Ministry, and perhaps refer others, and even become a part of the ministry.

Evaluations will be completed at the end of each program, and the core team will evaluate the effectiveness of said programs. Comfort care items will be evaluated by individual Elizabeth Ministers, based on recipient's response.

I write this letter in high praise of Elizabeth Ministries active here in our parishes in Aberdeen. While still new to the pastorate and the various ministries, I have had the opportunity to twice hear what Elizabeth Ministries does for women in need. Amber Watson has presented to both of our staff at St. Mary's and at Sacred Heart to describe their work and purpose.

I believe this ministry is particularly beautiful in its simplicity. These women do not proport to have a fix for someone's problems other than Christ. It is a proposal of Christ through a simple human interaction. This ministry takes into account the real need of a human presence. It isn't about handouts or a disembodied charity that wants to rid itself quickly of a needy person; rather, the aim of Elizabeth ministries is to walk alongside women in any kind of pain or perceived isolation by staying in front of them in friendship.
